Turning Points of My Life

This is a follow up to the attempt in touching on the movement called "Turning Point." I have expanded my thoughts with the hope of making it more understandable. People believe a successful Christian ministry could not happen on College Campus' around the world. The surprising element is this is happening among outstanding youth of gender, color and nationality. I can understand since it happened to me as a teenager. God has planted a deep hunger in young hearts for the personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

If you have seen or heard the Turning Point and it has touched you, as it has me, participation in the Lord's Supper will be the most significant Communion Service in the history of your Christian Faith. I am reminded of Jesus meeting with his disciples and saying words like these; "All power has been given to me in heaven and earth, therefore go forth and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, for I am with you to the end of the age." These words are for us as we join with the Spiritual force taking place throughout the world. It is time for the churches to wake up and join the Turning Point Spiritual Force that is moving youth around the world to accept Jesus Christ as their personal Savior. For me there have been three Turning Point's in my life. At nine I made my profession and received Christian baptism. My close cousin Dudley Strange joined me in expressing his faith. In my teen years we had a boy's prayer group that helped me to understand my personal relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ. The verbal acceptance of Jesus became the living person within. Turning Point was when I humbly agreed to accept God's calling to the Gospel Ministry after six years of His calling. The past two weeks have refreshed the Turning Points of my past. To see a Christian die for his faith as a Martyr moved me to join thousands of others who wept his death and rejoiced in praising God for his victory in Christ. I have never hesitated to confess Jesus as my Lord and now I will openly, joyfully Proclaim Him any time in any place. It is in this faith that we hear the words of the Apostle Paul instruct the proper use of the Lord's Supper (1 Corinthians 11:23-26) (Pew Bible). Reports had it that some would come to the Lord's Supper due to hunger and others may come in a drunk condition. Paul did not commend them for this so he gave these words: "For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when He was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said "this is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way He took the cup also, after supper saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this as often as you drink it in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes. We extend Jesus' invitation to all baptized believers who humbly trust Jesus as Savior who in His death forgives sins.
