Minister's Minute

There's a saying about delicious desserts: "You've saved the best for last." In a way, this applies to the seventh and final church mentioned in Revelation—Laodicea. When compared to the other six churches, Laodicea seems to encompass all of them. It reminds me of the military's Code of Justice: after listing all the detailed laws, there's often one general clause that covers anything not specifically mentioned. Laodicea feels like that clause—a final word wrapping up the full message to all the churches. Jesus' words to Laodicea might sound like harsh condemnation at first. He describes them as "lukewarm"—neither hot nor cold—and ready to be spit out. But this is not rejection. It's a loving rebuke meant to wake them up, to revive them.

Christ ends His message with an invitation to all seven churches. He states, "He who conquers, I will grant him to sit with Me on My Thorne, as I Myself conquered and sat down with my Father on His Throne." As Christ surveyed the inner most life of the church, He saw three repairs needing to be made for healing this middle position. They were to change their understanding of value. God was to be understood as faith, not gold stored away in a bank. This church appears to be very prosperous yet appearing as a poverty-stricken group. A mixture of confusion of value made them very slack in their zeal of expressing outward dedication of faith to Jesus Christ. "For you say, I am rich, I have prospered, and I need nothing not knowing you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked. I

counsel you to buy from Me gold refined by fire so you may be rich." A second change needing to be made is a change in garments, "White garments to clothe you and to keep the shame of your nakedness from being seen." These new garments are the righteousness that cannot come from their fancy clothes but from Christ's love and forgiveness. This love comes from his sacrifice on the Cross making our outward appearance capable of exposing His righteousness. One other change always needed can only come from the Divine Source. The salve for the eyes to give a clearer vision of Christ who says, "and salve to anoint your eyes that you may see.

Jesus was ready and willing to see these changes made. How do we conquer and sit with Him on His Throne? He answers this in a way we cannot deny. He stands at the door knocking, waiting for our hearts to hear the knock and enter only to fine true gold, righteous clothing and a new vision. Do you hear Him? Open the door again, again, and again. Opening the door, we have conquered! Victory to everyone who opens. The seat is waiting for all who sit with him on the Throne.
